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Miss Amazing Pageant Puts Girls with Disabilities First

Congratulations to Kristin Crumrine, Illinois Miss Amazing Queen, Senior Miss Division. We wish her all the best when she competes this summer in Omaha, NE for the nation title.

The following article was featured in "TODAY News", September 7, 2013.

At one very special pageant, it isn't about who has the best voice or the prettiest dress. It is, however, still about the tiara.

"Every girl at the Miss Amazing pageant receives a crown because every girl to an extent in her own way is Miss Amazing, just by participating in the event and really pushing her limits," said Jordan Somer, the founder of the Miss Amazing pageant, which is just for girls with physical and mental disabilities.

"We have participants who have Down syndrome; we have participants who have autism, high-functioning, low-functioning. We have participants that don't use words to talk," Somer told TODAY. Somer created the Miss Amazing pageant when she was just 13 years old, and now, seven years later, pageants are held across the country. Events, which include an introduction ceremony, evening wear and talents like martial arts and singing, are designed to help build confidence and self-esteem.

The Central Illinois Down Syndrome Organization (CIDSO) is a not-for-profit organization of families and interested persons working to increase public awareness, support families, and improve opportunities for those touched by Down syndrome. Established in 1974 to act as a support service, we serve Bloomington, Normal, and the McLean County area. Our organization is the oldest Down syndrome parent group in Illinois and the second oldest in the nation.

New Parent Outreach

The process of acceptance begins as soon as Down syndrome is suspected. To support parents and extended family during this time, a parent outreach member will gladly make hospital or home visits. Enrichment/Participation Fund
